Members:

Regular lunch meetings during Luke Chapter MOAA meeting year for social interaction and planned presentations Special meetings may be called to work on group-determined projects Virtual meetings:

- SS monthly meetings for those as stated above (Implementation in Phase II A)
- Luke Chapter MOAA monthly meetings for incapacitated or other homebound persons, as need is determined (Implementation in Phase II B)

Transportation:

Facilitate ride-share for those needing it for SS meetings

Phase I

- Develop Steering Committee
- Identify Program Presentation Ideas
 - Example:
 - Mentoring Programs
 - Accessing Casualty Assistance
- Initiate Member Communication Program
 - New SS Buddy program Mentoring (listening, coaching)
 - Birthday, Thinking of You, Other Cards
 - Quarterly member contact (phone calls, etc.)
 - Quarter Newsletter/snail mail to those without email










IMPLEMENTATION

 - Initiate Other meetings as needed






BOARD REQUEST
